Wednesday, October 15

7:00-8:00 p.m. Keynote Address—Dr. Terry Novak, Johnson & Wales University

Twenty-five years ago, the fledgling Atlantic Center for Learning Communities, steered by learning communities scholars and practitioners Anne Goodsell Love (now Anne Van Der Karr) and Roberta Matthews, held an afternoon event at Holyoke Community College in Massachusetts that would turn into an annual two-day curriculum planning retreat. Since that time many changes and challenges have visited the landscape of higher education: some borne out of budget trials, some borne out of a

global pandemic, some borne out of the political atmosphere locally as well as globally. Through it all, one thing has remained constant: Community matters. How do we remain grounded through the many layers of our learning communities? How do we use the lessons of our past to inform the challenges of our present? How do we continue our work with courage so as to continue to form students of community and conviction? Join Terry Novak for a lively and passionate discussion at the 2025 ACLC Curriculum Planning Retreat keynote address!

Terry Novak has served on the leadership team of the ACLC for almost 25 years and has co-directed the ACLC for over a decade. An English professor at Johnson & Wales University, Terry has also taught in learning communities for 25 years, directing the program for many of those years. Along with her community of LC practitioners and colleagues, she has presented regularly on learning communities, including the blending of community service into a learning community. In a myriad of ways, community informs Terry's life and work.
